Our camp session is getting closer and it is time to think about packing your bags, preparing your minds, and journeying to camp! We, Michelle Scribner (she/her) and Patty Fox (she/her), are your Deans for your camp experience and we are excited to work alongside Pilgrim Lodge's summer staff to provide you with a respite from the business of life outside of camp! You will read a bit about us later!

Pilgrim Lodge Pride

Pride Across the Ages will be an experience where campers of all ages:

- Find a safe space to be fully themselves, explore identity, and share their stories.
- Find affirming space for conversations around spirituality and love for self and others.
- Experience the fun of being at camp!

What to Expect: Our camp program is a condensed version of a week-long camp experience! Be prepared for lots of "traditional" summer camp activities including swimming, boating, arts and crafts, songs, games and "out-doorsy" fun! We will have opportunities to share time of Sacred Gathering together, engage in intentional conversation as well as times to just be goofy! In addition to all of our classic "campy" activities we will be exploring ways we are connected to one another!

Some special activities to look forward to include a writing workshop exploring our own stories, and the opportunity to share our stories, as well as a performance by Taiko Maine Dojo, a Japanese drumming group based out of Portland, Maine.

We will also have the opportunity to participate in a discussion run by the organization OUT Maine exploring the unique needs of families with members in the LGBTQ+ community here in Maine and nationally.

Registration begins at 2pm and will run through 5:30pm on Friday, August 9th.

(Registration will be extended to accommodate those traveling from farther away/ work schedules etc.- please just let us know by contacting the camp office!) Please do not arrive before 2pm, as we will still be busy preparing for your arrival. When you arrive at camp you will be greeted by camp staff, directed to unload your luggage and check in with the deans. Additional time before supper will be spent settling into cabins, and un-programmed down time with your family unit- or meeting new friends! At 5:30 we will be participating in an all camp Welcome Tour to get to know our shared space for the weekend. If at all possible, please arrive in time to participate! Friday evening supper will be provided at the conclusion of our Welcome Tour, around 6pm. Our official programing will begin at 7pm with establishing camp norms, house-keeping items and introductory activities! Camp programming will conclude on Sunday

August 11th around 2pm. We ask that Campers plan to be journeying home by not later than 3pm.

Housing: Campers will be housed in cabins based on family units or for smaller units or individuals based on gender inclusive preferences. Please contact the camp office to request any specific housing needs! Cabins are reasonably equipped with electricity, a porch, single bunks and a bathroom and shower with hot water.

Multi-Age Camp Model: What makes Pride Across the Ages a unique and special program at Pilgrim Lodge is that it is open to campers of ALL ages! Because of this you may notice some differences from other camp programs (both Pilgrim Lodge and elsewhere). We ask that you be mindful of the variety of ages present at our program. Adults are responsible for the supervision of their children AT ALL TIMES for the duration of the program UNLESS care has specifically been given to camp staff for an activity. Our program does not have a counseling staff for supervision of children.

Technology: We understand that technology use is often an integral part of our daily lives, and that for many of us completely "unplugging" is not possible due to responsibilities beyond our camp boundaries. That being said, we ask that you restrict your technology use as much as possible during our time at camp as we create an intentional "in person" community with the individuals around us. With our technology comes the ability to take pictures. There are lots of fun things to photograph at camp (wait until you see a PL sunset!). Please obtain permission from individuals (and guardians) before photographing OR sharing pictures to social media- and save the social media for when you get home!

Faith and Worship: It is important to note that while Pride Across the Ages is housed at Pilgrim Lodge and part of the Maine United Church of Christ programing, our camp program is open and accepting of all faiths and spiritual beliefs. This means that people of all faiths, or no faith are welcome and celebrated. We want to be sensitive to the fact that many LGBTQ individuals have been, or are, hurt by involvement and influence of religious organizations. We want you to know that Pilgrim Lodge is a safe place for all. Both Pilgrim Lodge and the United Church of Christ recognize LGBTQ identities and celebrate diversity. While the backdrop of our camp has Christian symbols (crosses, fish, biblical quotations), and our programming will have a spiritual tone, **No attempts to convert or indoctrinate anyone to a particular faith will take place**. All of our camp activities are considered "challenge by choice". If something does not feel like a good fit- please always feel free to adapt your participation to meet your needs and always feel welcome to discuss those needs with camp staff or us, your deans!

Most of our Sacred Gatherings will be led by Rev. Patty Fox, an ordained UCC pastor. These gatherings will include ideas and symbolism, Biblical text references and music of this Christian tradition. We will try to communicate the content of our service in advance and campers are welcomed and encouraged to make participation choices that are comfortable and affirming for them. Alternatives to our Sacred Gatherings will be offered (such as guided meditations, poetry exercises, or labyrinth walks), or campers can create their own spiritual space. We would love to

share other traditions if campers are willing to lead! Please communicate to us if there is anything we should know about your spiritual journey and preferences!

What to Bring: We bet you are ready to pack your bags! Pilgrim Lodge is located in Central Maine and is subject to varying weather, even in summer months. We encourage you to keep an eye on weather forecasts for our time at camp AND pack for the unexpected. The temperature right on the lake can get cooler than you might guess, and Maine weather has already shown us some unpredictability! Based on this information you should include:

- Warm sleeping clothes (for possible cold nights)
- Warm daytime clothes (just in case)
- A rain jacket or poncho (just in case)
- At least one pair of closed-toe shoes like sneakers, hiking boots, etc
- A Fancy and/or Fabulous (gender affirming) outfit for the Dress-Up Dinner on Saturday
- Pillow & Pillowcase
- Bedding (sleeping bag or sheets+warm blanket)
- Stuffed Animal
- Towel for swimming and showering
- Soap & Shampoo
- Toothbrush & Toothpaste
- A notebook & pen
- Water bottle
- Book(s) to read
- A sacred text (whatever this means for you)
- Flashlight
- Bug Spray and sunscreen
- Money for store merchandise
- Medications
- Supplies for your art: musical instruments, paints, etc.
- Pride Swag: flags, t-shirts, etc. All identity pride flags encouraged

What NOT to Bring:

- Alcohol, marijuana or illegal drugs
- Weapons (including pocket knives), fireworks
- Pets (contact the office in the event that a camper utilizes a service animal)
- Jewelry, SCUBA Equipment, "Healies," skateboards, in-line skates, handheld games

We are so excited that you have made the choice, the leap of faith perhaps, to join us at camp! Thank you for being a part of something a little unknown and for helping to make it GREAT! If you have any questions, concerns or needs- PLEASE reach out to us! We can't wait to have a weekend of healing, renewal, fellowship and good ol' camp FUN!
